On Tuesday, February 13, 2024 Lind School District residents will vote on two measures affecting students in our community; a two-year replacement Educational Programs & Operations (EP&O) Levy and a two-year replacement Capital Levy for Educational Technology Improvements.

What do these levies support?

Replacement Educational Programs & Operations Levy

Levies provide local funding that bridges the gap between what the state and federal governments pay and the actual costs of operating our schools. Many of these costs are not funded by the state. EP&O levy funds support approximately 11% of the overall district budget.

Eight facts every citizen should know about school levies in Lind School District



Lind citizens are being asked to renew two replacement levies by February 13, 2024 to cover important programs and services not fully funded by the state.



Both propositions replace expiring levies and are not new taxes. Voters approved two levies in 2022. These levies expire at the end of 2024 and require a vote to renew the measures.



Levies are still needed to fund schools.

While the state has increased funding for schools in recent years, state funding does not cover the full cost of operating a school district. Levies are still needed to fund nearly 11% of current costs. Levies are also needed to pay for critical infrastructure like HVAC systems, boilers, and roofs. They also fund a portion of our technology costs.



The levies help all of our kids across all schools. Levy dollars are used at all schools to provide programs and services to kids in preschool through 12th grade.



The Educational Programs and Operations Levy will continue funding current programs our kids need and our communities expect.

These programs include athletics, music, performing arts, transportation, special education, and highly capable/honors programs. The levy also funds teachers, counselors, school nurse and support staff. The levy allows for expanded course offerings so kids can take college courses and a wider variety of electives.



Tax rates for local levies will remain consistent over the life of the levies.

The amount requested by the district is actual but the tax rates listed in the voters pamphlet are estimates. This is because the actual tax rates are determined by the property values within the county, we anticipate the rates will remain the same, or even decrease, over the next three years.



The Educational Technology Levy funds a majority of the technology used across the district. As technology changes, students across all schools need access to current learning tools and a strong technology infrastructure. If approved, the Enrichment & Technology Levy continues to support on our promise to provide 1:1 technology tools for every student and ensure equity across the district.



The two-year proposal provides the district an opportunity for more consistent planning through sustained funding. A two-year levy also saves taxpayers the election costs of running a levy each year.

Replacement Educational Programs & Operations Levy

Estimated Annual Amount

The proposed levy is \$653,000 for 2025 and \$665,000 for 2026. This will require an estimated collection rate of \$1.09 per \$1,000 assessed valuation. The estimated effect on property owners is as follows:

Replacement Capital Levy for Educational Technology

Estimated Annual Amount

The proposed levy is \$25,000 for 2025 and \$25,000 for 2026. This will require an estimated collection rate of \$ 0.05 per \$1,000 assessed valuation. The estimated effect on property owners is as follows:

\$100,000	\$14.00/year	\$5.00/year
