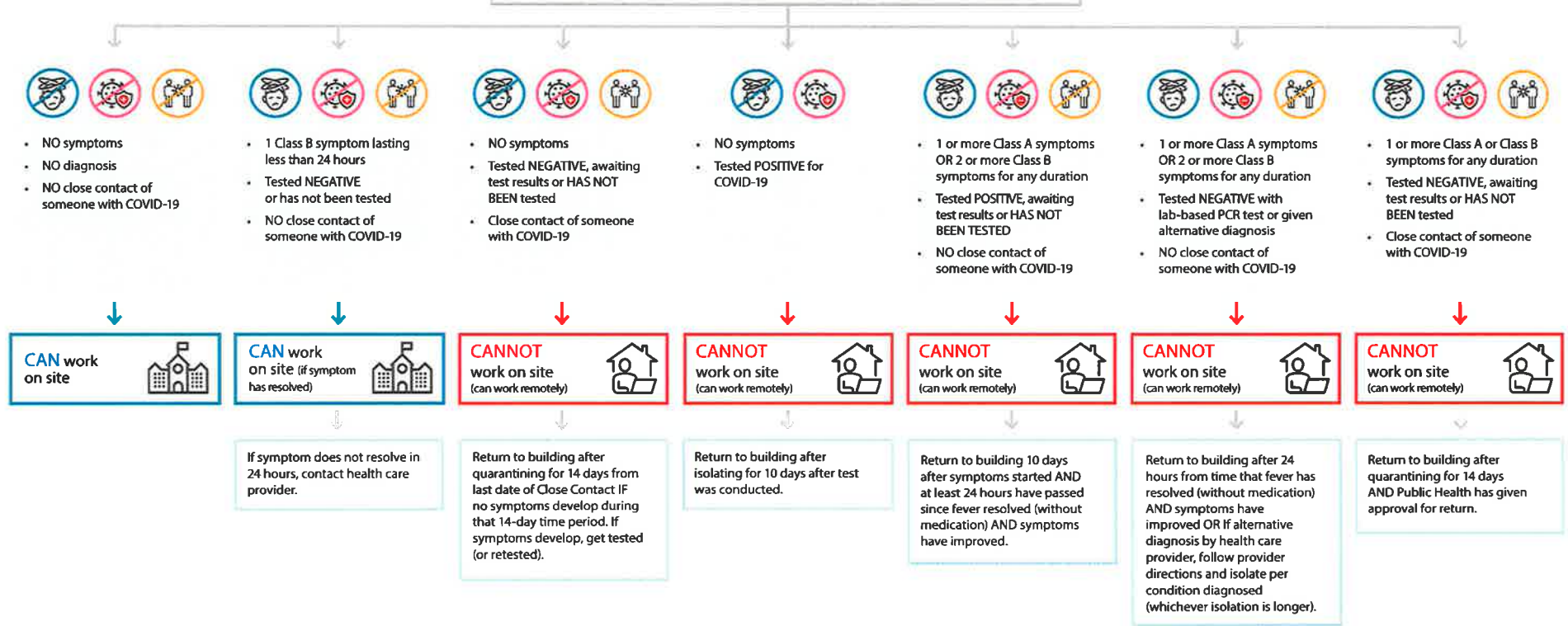


COVID-19 Staff Symptom Flow Chart

COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

CLASS A:

- Fever (defined as subjective or 100.4°F or higher)
- Chills
- Cough
- Loss of sense of taste/smell
- Shortness of breath

CLASS B:

- Fatigue
- Headache
- Muscle/body aches
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

CLOSE CONTACT INFO

"Close Contact" means being within 6 feet of a person with COVID-19 for 15 cumulative minutes over a 24 hour period. Members of a household are considered to be close contacts. Close contacts are identified by Public Health.

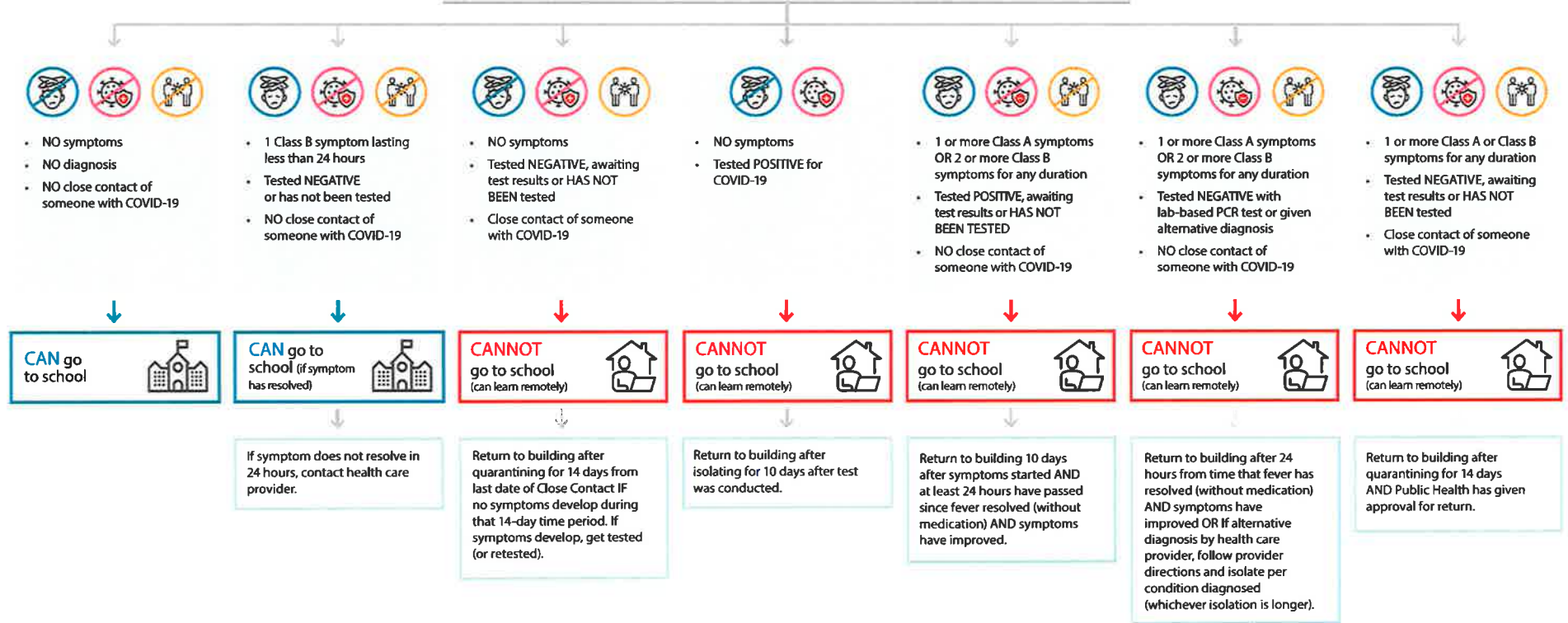
